



Bell Helpers

Ring a bell (or bowl) to begin and end worship.

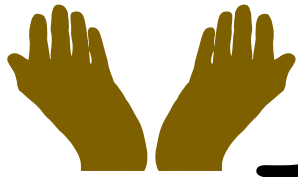
- When it is time for worship to begin, the pair of helpers takes turn ringing their bells, ringing seven times total.
- After the candles are extinguished at the end of worship, repeat the same process, perhaps switching who goes first.



Candle Helpers

Light and extinguish candles.

- After the bells finish ringing (7 times), show your candle to your camera. Light your candle and show it to the camera again.
- After we bless one another, show your candle to your camera. "Change the light" by extinguishing it, holding it in front of the camera so we catch a glimpse of the smoke rising and moving away.



Prayer Leaders

Lead the people in the Prayer of the Day.

- Lead the prayer repeat-after-me style, using the line breaks, as indicated.
- Split the prayer between leaders line by line.
- See the prayer, below.

Prayer of the Day:

Let us pray. Repeat after me.

We know that you (we know that you)

are a *Generous God* (are a *Generous God*)

and because of your love (and because of your love)

we can be a generous people. (we can be a generous people)

Open our hearts. (open our hearts)

Open our hands. (open our hands)

Open our lives. (open our lives)

In Jesus' name, we pray. (in Jesus' name we pray) **Amen.**



Psalm Readers

Read the Psalm out loud to the congregation.

- One reader can read the odd numbered verses.
- The second reader can read the even numbered verses.
- Pause at the bolded words for the Psalm response leader to lead the people in the response. Notice that the Psalm begins with the response.
- Breen will give you the Psalm.



Psalm Response Leader

Lead the response during the Psalm with words and gestures.

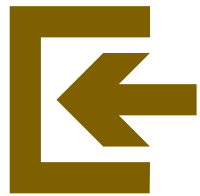
- The Psalm response today is
You open your hand,
satisfying the desire of every living thing.
- Decide how you want to show this response using gestures.
- Lead the response with words and gestures during the bolded words of the Psalm. Notice that the response is first. You will demonstrate one time, then ask the people to do it with you.
- Breen will give you the Psalm.

Welcomer

Host our worship experience.

- Welcome folks to the space (use intro slide)
- Invite into spoken and unspoken worship leadership (8-12 roles) (tech person sends to sacristy break out room)
- Equip with QR code and links in the chat for the worship slides and learner slides (see outline)
- Invite learners to use Zoom chat or text (929) 266-4662 for questions/noticings



Song Leader

Lead the people in song.

- After the prayer of the day, model/teach "There is Enough" by Kerri Meyer to the group.
- After the Psalm, reprise "There is Enough" with the people, perhaps adding a new verse (God has enough/Oh, enough and some to share).
- After the Connecting Generations conversations, reprise "There is Enough," perhaps adding a third verse (I Am Enough/Oh, enough with some to share).

Pastor

Lead the worship experience.

- Prayer Practice: Spiral Hands (in: ways that God has been generous to you, out: ways you have been/want to be generous towards God and others)
- Connecting Generations: invite into conversation (How has God been generous to you? In what ways do you want to be generous to others?)
- Lord's Prayer: embodied
- Blessing One Another: Trace spiral on forehead or hand, "God is generous with you, be generous to others"
